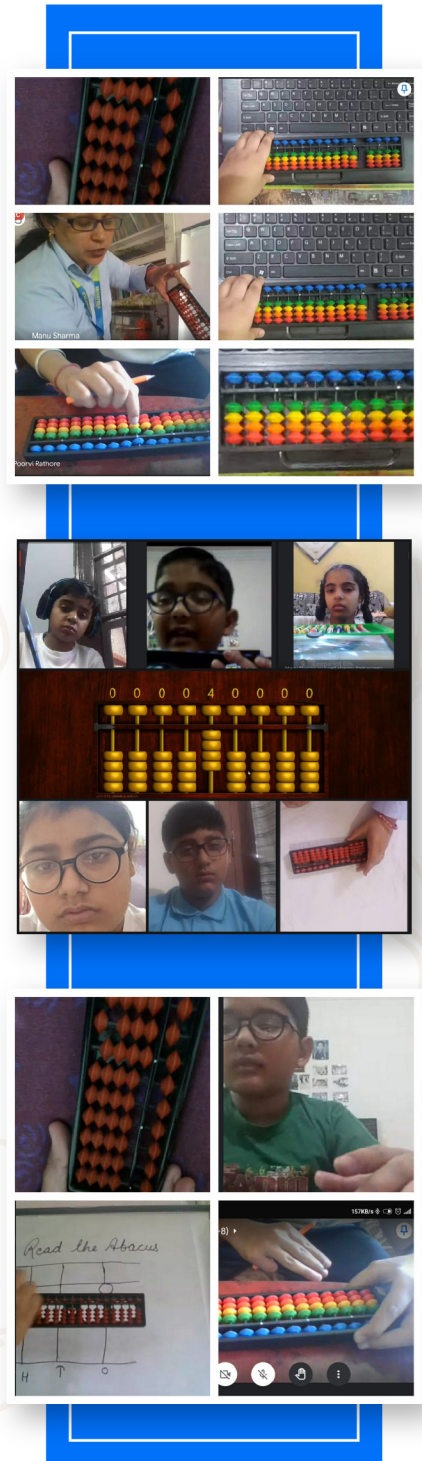


Abacus Club

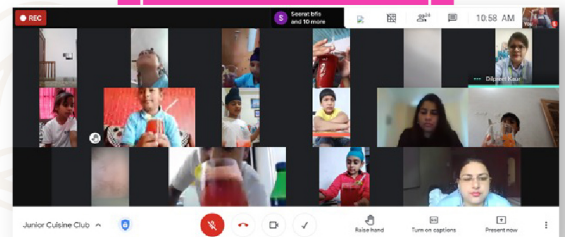
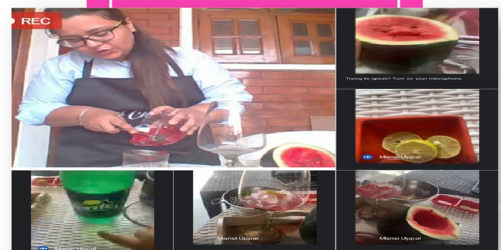
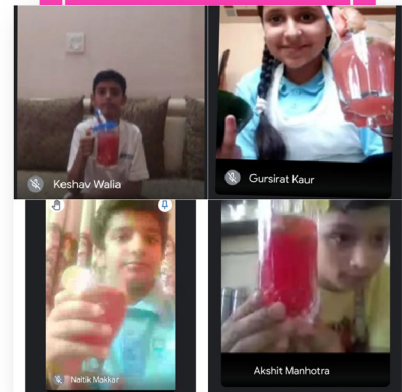
The club is started at two-level one as Junior Cuisine Club and another as Senior cuisine club to deliver the knowledge according to their level of understanding.

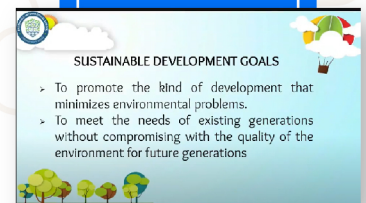
Eco Sustainability Club

Literary Club

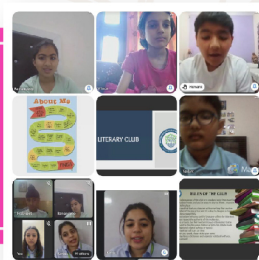
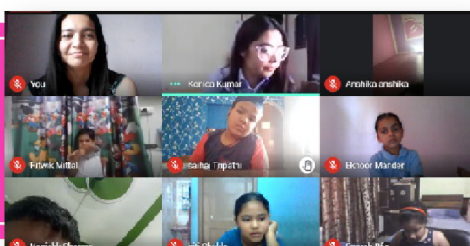
Towards the second session of the club, different activities were organized for junior as well as for seniors.

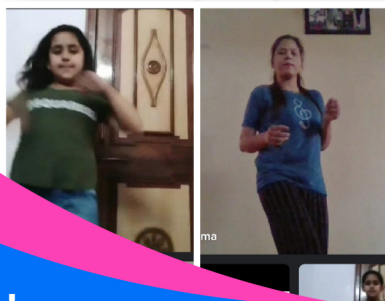
With the motive to enhance the hidden talent of music and dance among the students, BFIS has its unique “Performing Arts Club”.

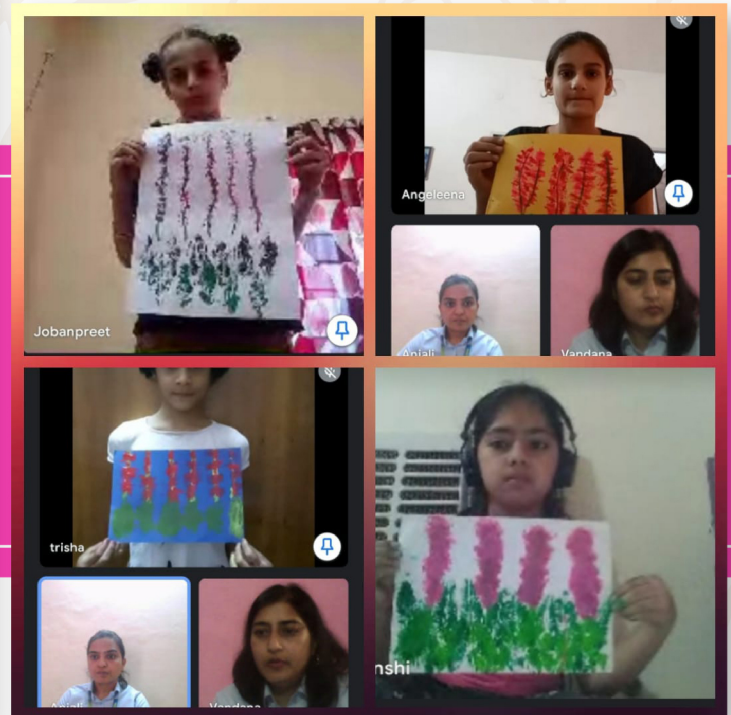




Visual Art Club

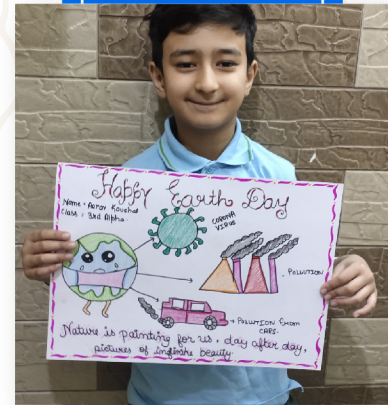
