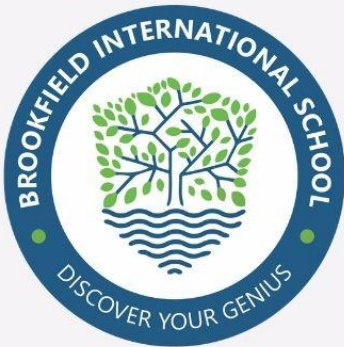
TREE PLANTING ON THE OCCASION OF UN INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE
